## **ASSISTED DYING BILL**

As you know, I will, by convention, be the penultimate speaker when your Bill is debated on Friday 18 July. However, given the number of speakers, I thought it would be helpful to set out the Government's position in advance of the debate.

The Government believes that any change to the law in this emotive area is an issue of individual conscience. It is, rightly in our view, a matter for Parliament to decide rather than a matter of Government policy.

It follows that the Government takes a neutral position on whether the Assisted Dying Bill should progress. I shall do this when I speak on Friday.

I am copying this letter to all colleagues who have signed up to speak at the debate and am placing a copy in the House Library. I look forward to the debate.
