Infrastructure Bill: Planning

During the debate on clause 20 of the Infrastructure Bill on 10 July, my predecessor Baroness Stowell, agreed to provide Baroness Andrews with further information about resource levels in local planning departments before and after the Killian and Pretty Review Final Report was published. As Baroness Stowell has now left her role in the Department for Communities and Local Government and I will be taking forward her work on the Bill, I have been asked to reply.

I regret to inform you that the Government does not collect data on the number of planning officers employed by local authorities. It is for authorities, as individual employers, to manage the structure and scale of their workforce in light of their local circumstances and in a way that enables them to meet their priorities and offers value for money for local taxpayers.

One important factor in influencing the number of planning officers is the size of the workload. When Joanna Killian and David Pretty were examining the planning application process in 2007/08, 596,000 planning decisions were made. However, the year that the Killian and Pretty Review Final Report was published saw a dramatic reduction in development activity due to the economic downturn and, as the table below shows, a corresponding dramatic drop in the number of planning decisions. In the most recent year that we have records for, the level of planning decisions remains in line with the post downturn trend.
