Regarding Parliamentary Question 34610: "To ask the Secretary of State for Health, for what length of time Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust had to wait for Disclosure and Debarring Service checks for (a) doctors and (b) nurses offered posts for accident and emergency in each month in 2015."

Our response is as follows: We can provide details for the new starters in A&E however with respect to the majority of internal transfers, we would not need to do a DBS check for them and do not record the information or are able to track easily internal transfers. The shaded boxes in the table below are where we had no DBS checks that month for ED. NHS staff more and more are signing up to the DBS up-date service which means that their DBS check is undertaken on the day they come in for their pre-employment checks on line and therefore there is no delay.
