Health Profiles 2008 are now available to view online. The profiles give a snapshot of health for each local council using key health indicators such as smoking and life expectancy rates. This enables comparison locally, regionally and over time. Alongside the profiles, DH commissioned the London Health Observatory to produce the Health Inequalities Intervention Tool to support all PCTs and local authorities with local delivery planning and commissioning to narrow gaps in life expectancy.

A new report to commemorate '60 years of research in the NHS benefiting patients' is now available. This could mean a patient with Parkinson's disease, for example, would be told about any ongoing research into their condition and might be able to take part in trials that could lead to an improvement or even cure.
