Probation Trusts

The 35 probation trusts are individual Non-departmental Public Bodies and have their own staffing and finance systems. Exit data is collected by each trust, but not broken down into the categories requested. In order to answer the question, it would be necessary to obtain the information from each individual trust which would incur disproportionate costs.

Other NDPBs

Full details for some or all of the years requested are not available from the following bodies.

- Criminal Injuries Compensation Authority
- Judicial Appointments Commission
- Legal Aid Agency (formerly the Legal Services Commission)
- Legal Services Board
- Parole Board

Finance and staffing details within each of the bodies are held on various electronic and paper management systems, and in some cases are not available centrally. Providing the level of detail requested would involve producing, extracting and collating detail from numerous reports and incur disproportionate costs.

The details requested are not held centrally, therefore each body needed to be contacted separately in order to obtain the information from their individual staffing and financial systems.



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
