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Dear Baroness McIntosh,

I am writing to thank you for your contribution to the Committee Stage debate on Part 1 of the Energy Bill 2022 on 7 September, and to follow up on your question in relation to origin of the UK gas supply mix.

I have confirmed my initial response regarding the percentage of our gas supply mix which is made up of domestic production. Over the previous 5 years, 2017-2021, 45% of supply was made up of gas from the UK Continental Shelf. Similarly, just over 4% of supply came via the interconnectors from Continental Europe, of which the Belgian Interconnector (Interconnector Ltd) supplied 1.9%, and the Dutch interconnector (BBL) supplied 2.2%.

I can confirm that Norway, our reliable energy partner, constituted approximately 35% of the supply mix over this period.

With respect to Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG), I can confirm this constituted 15% of the supply mix. The aggregate import capacity provided by the three LNG terminals I referenced provides the UK with one of the largest LNG import infrastructures in Europe.

I hope you find this response helpful in addressing the questions you raised in debate, and I would, of course, be happy to discuss further if you would find that helpful.
