A decision was taken to approve the Libraries NI Business Plan 2023/24 to support operational planning, delivery, and performance monitoring.

A decision was taken to appoint a Commissioner to the Board of the Charity Commission from a merit-based process for the selection of candidates, to allow compliance with the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.

A decision was taken to enable the auto-enrolment of the Department's non legal judicial office holders into the workplace pension scheme NEST (National Employment Savings Trust).

A decision was taken to commence a public appointment competition for new Northern Ireland Housing Executive Board Members.

A decision was taken to appoint an interim Vice-Chair to the Sport NI Board and to commence a public appointment competition for a new Vice-Chair.

A decision was taken to extend the appointment of one Member of the Historic Buildings Council from 1 September 2023 until a formal reappointment is made.

A decision was taken to approve Belfast City Council's request to lease lands at River Terrace, Belfast to the Lower Ormeau Residents' Association Group at a nominal rent and therefore less than best price (deemed to be £1,500), in line with Section 10 of The Recreation and Youth Service (Northern Ireland) Order 1986.

Department for Economy

A decision was taken to approve funding for the Digital Transformation Flexible Fund.

A decision was taken to maintain the status quo in relation to the mandatory status of crush protection devices on allterrain vehicles.

A decision was taken to publish the Department's Disability Action Plan and Audit of Inequalities for the period 2022 – 2027.

A decision was taken to agree to the extension to Northern Ireland of the Accounting Standards (Prescribed Bodies) (United States of America and Japan) (Amendment) Regulations 2023.

Department of Finance

A decision was taken to request that the UK Government amend Article 4(a)(v) of the Statutory Rules (Northern Ireland) Order 1979.

A decision was taken to approve the NI Water Total Rewards Evolution (Pay Transformation), which involves restructuring NI Water's salary framework from pay progression to performance related pay linked to market rates.

A decision was taken to extend an interim solution in respect of terms and conditions for a group of staff in the Department for Infrastructure's Roads and Rivers teams.

A decision was taken to renew Northern Ireland Civil Service membership of the Stonewall Diversity Champions Programme.

A decision was taken to approve the extension of the provisions in the Coronavirus Act 2020 in relation to death registration in Northern Ireland.

Department of Health

A decision was taken to extend the public appointments of five Non-Executive Members across three of the Department's Arm's Length Bodies (ALBs): the Belfast Health and Social Care Trust; the Northern Ireland Ambulance Service Trust; and the Northern Ireland Fire and Rescue Service.

A decision was taken to include Northern Ireland in a procurement by the UK Health Security Agency which may enable an immunisation programme against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) for older adults in the autumn of 2023.

A decision was taken to take forward the following regulations:

- The Firefighters (Remedial Service) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2023

A decision was taken to issue updated guidance to Health and Social Care organisations on change or withdrawal of services.

A decision was taken to change of the name of the "Belfast Metropolitan Transport Plan" to the "Eastern Transport Plan".

A decision was also taken to publicly launch the Eastern Transport Plan and the Fermanagh and Omagh Transport Plan.

A decision was taken to issue guidance to ensure that the Department for Infrastructure fulfils its regulation role of the NI taxi industry, by ensuring that local taxi operators are aware and compliant with Court judgements issued in 2021 by the Supreme Court and the Divisional Court in England & Wales on the interpretation of the Private Hire Vehicles (London) Act 1998, regarding the acceptance of bookings from passengers.

A decision was taken to issue a Notice of Opinion to refuse an outline application for a mixed-use development and to issue a Notice of Opinion to approve a full application for a major road development, both at Blaris, Lisburn West and, subject to no request for a hearing, to issue the subsequent planning decisions.

A decision was taken to allow the Driver & Vehicle Agency (DVA) to test cars (up to 3,500kg) and motorcycles under their chassis number, rather than their Ukrainian registration number if the vehicle belongs to an individual residing in the UK under one of the Ukrainian visa schemes.

A decision was taken to make the Confirmation Order under Article 13 of the Drainage (NI) Order 1973 to confirm the Cutts Control Structure Refurbishment Scheme.

A decision was taken to give approval for the Department for Transport to make the necessary legislative amendments to the Road Traffic Order (Northern Ireland) 1981 on behalf of the Department for Infrastructure in order to retain the interpretive effects of Articles 3 &

10 of the European Motor Insurance Directive (2009/103/EC), due to sunset on 31 December 2023.

A decision was taken to update the advice on NI Direct and to launch a targeted consultation on proposals to afford ex-GB/NI issued driving licence holders the same rights as other EEA licence holders on becoming resident again in NI.

A decision was taken on the Department's response to the 2023-24 in year technical and budget information gathering exercise commissioned by the Department of Finance.

A decision was taken to publish the Department for Infrastructure Business Plan for 2023-24 and the associated equality screening form.

A decision was taken to publish the Driver & Vehicle Agency (DVA) Business Plan for 2023-24 and the associated equality screening form

Department of Justice

A decision was taken to revoke the licences of two life licensees under Article 9(1) of the Life Sentences (Northern Ireland) Order 2001.

A decision was taken not to take a position on a request from the Home Office on whether legislative proposals to tackle the use of machetes and other bladed articles in committing crime should be extended to Northern Ireland, in the absence of an Assembly and

	Executive. A decision was taken in May to publish the Organised Crime Task Force (OCTF) Annual Report and Threat Assessment 2021/2022. A decision was taken in June to issue a public consultation on proposals to update and reform the Access NI List of Specified Offences.
Executive Office	A decision was taken to defer a request from a member of the public to conduct a research visit to the Maze Long Kesh site. A decision was taken not to specify schools (where the employing school authority is neither the Education Authority nor the Council of Catholic Maintained Schools) as public authorities for the purposes of the monitoring arrangements under the Fair Employment (School Teachers) Act (NI) 2022 which extends the protection in FETO to teachers from May 2024. This decision will be kept under review in conjunction with Equality Commission Northern Ireland (ECNI) and Department of Education (DE).
