#### Explanatory notes:

1. The figures highlighted from 2022 differ from those provided in the previous response to the Rt Hon John Healey MP's Written Parliamentary Question 188829 provided on 13 November 2023, which was also laid in the Library of the House. This is due to routine data cleansing to ensure an accurate record.
2. Analysis of the data above should take account of the changing composition of the Surface Fleet and acknowledge that, where an output is delivered by a small number of ships, the data will show a temporary decrease when ships are in planned upkeep.
3. Current and future plans for the fleet are centred around several classes of ships and other capabilities that are in build this decade: Type 26 Frigates, Type 31 Frigates, Fleet Solid Support, Multi-Role Support Ship and the Mine Hunting Capability programme. Each of these programmes will contribute to the RN continuing to deliver its operational commitments and ultimately increase its readiness and global presence.
