The Durham Miner's Gala is a time for celebration, but also a time for reflection. Reflection on what our country has been through, and the values we share which have kept us going. Values of fairness, community and service. Values that my Labour government hold at our very core.

Now gathering for the 138th time, I'm sorry not to be able to join you all on the Racecourse this weekend.

But know that everything my Labour government does in the coming years, will be driven by those values, just as we carried them throughout the election campaign.
