I am writing further to the House of Lords Debate on 9 January 2025, on 'National Insurance: Employer Contributions'.

At Hansard Column 798, you asked, "The Government's new burdens doctrine has been in place since ... can the noble Baroness explain why the Government are not following their own guidance in this case?".

To which I responded, "... the local government funding settlement saw a **3.7% real-terms** increase in funding."

I should have instead said, "...the local government funding settlement saw a 3.5% real-terms increase in funding."

Please accept my apologies for this error and I trust there has been no misunderstanding as a result.
