UK Bus Manufacturing Expert Panel

Terms of Reference - March 2025

Background & Purpose

On 8 October 2024, the Department for Transport announced plans to create a new UK Bus Manufacturing Expert Panel. This panel will bring together industry experts and local leaders to explore ways to ensure the UK remains a leader in bus manufacturing.

These Terms of Reference seek to clarify the purpose of the expert panel, membership and function.

Role of the Expert Panel

The Expert Panel provides a structure to ensure effective cooperation and collaboration between government, bus manufacturers, bus operators, and local transport authorities. Engagement at senior level aims to promote understanding of key drivers impacting the UK bus industry, discussing governmental policies of mutual interest and establishing a forward look of potential fleet requirement/bus orders for the next 5-10 years.

The Department for Transport will provide a forward look of topics for discussion following steers from representatives of the bus industry. Meetings should be outcome focused and produce agreed actions.

Panel Objectives

The Expert Panel will focus on three central objectives:

1. Support UK Bus Manufacturing Growth

Develop an action plan in partnership with central and local governments and the bus sector to support UK manufacturing. The plan should aim to grow UK manufacturing businesses, increase their market share, and reduce reliance on imports, while prioritising the production of high-quality buses that meet the needs of passengers and operators.

2. Establish a Bus Order Pipeline

Develop a pipeline of likely and possible future bus orders to give better planning certainty to the sector and support manufacturer investment in product development; develop a collaborative approach between the main purchasers of buses to smoothing out peaks and troughs in the pipeline to improve efficiency.

3. Enhance Passenger-Centric Bus Design

Explore ways to improve future bus designs to meet the full range of passenger needs. Take a holistic approach to addressing issues faced by disabled people, women, and others who may encounter barriers to bus travel, aiming to reduce passenger conflicts and promote inclusivity.

Structure & Membership

The Panels membership will comprise of two classifications: Standing Members and Additional Members. Organisations will be represented by senior-level officials.

Standing Members will include Government departments, bus operators, local transport authorities and wider industry bodies. Additional Members will be invited to relevant meetings when particular issues are under consideration.

By exception: others may be invited as appropriate when particular issues are under consideration. Named members may nominate alternative attendees.

Chair and Secretariat Services

The role of chair, and responsibility for producing agendas, formal meeting notes and actions arising, shall be held by the Department for Transport.

After each monthly meeting, the Department for Transport shall share meeting minutes with members to ensure actions can be promptly taken throughout the panel's lifecycle.

The circulation of papers will be as follows:

- Commissioning of papers 14 days before
- Agenda 7 days before
- Circulation of papers 3 days before
- Minutes circulated up to 7 days after

Frequency of Meetings

The Panel will meet every 6 weeks for a period of 10-12 months. Meeting location will be shared 3 weeks ahead of the meeting. All meetings should be held in person, with remote access available via Microsoft Teams when required. Meetings will be recorded for note taking proposes, recordings will then be deleted.

Compliance Statement - to be read by the chair before each meeting

This meeting is gathered in accordance with the Terms of Reference shared on 12th March 2025.

We have a responsibility to all attendees to keep discussions within these Terms of Reference.

Attendees are free to not engage or leave the room during discussions relating to bus orders (current or future) and order strategies.

This will be reflected in the meeting minutes.

In no circumstances should our discussion:

- include any consensus discussion of individual corporate strategy, market behaviour or pricing policy; or
- extend to any kind of volume or price data (e.g. price levels, discounts, policies or margins) or customer specific information or other commercially sensitive information
- reveal the commercial circumstances or contractual relationship between specific parties.

The meeting minutes will record that this guidance was read out and agreed at the start of the meeting.
