Local Employability Provision is a voluntary programme for all eligible claimants including people who:

- are in work
- have a disability or health condition
- are at risk of long-term unemployment

The offer

Local Employability Provision is targeted provision offering tailored support to help claimants to find work or move closer to work. The provision will vary across all the 32 Local Authorities in Scotland.

Participation is voluntary. However, claimants are still subject to all existing requirements for their Labour Market regime.

Eligibility

Each offer will have their own eligibility conditions. Participants must:

- have the right to work in the UK (non-benefit participants)
- have the right to live in the UK and be resident in Scotland
- not be participating in Fair Start Scotland
- be resident within the corresponding local authority postcode area
