Dear Mr O'Brien,

Re: PQ88782 To ask the Secretary of State for Education, how many people have been employed by (a) OFSTED, (b) OFQUAL and (c) the Office for Students in each year since 2005.

Parliamentary Under-Secretary (Department for Education), Olivia Bailey, has asked Ofqual to respond directly to your recent Parliamentary Question. A copy of this response will be placed in the Libraries of both Houses.

Ofqual was established in April 2010 under the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009. Headcount figures from 2011 onwards are summarised below:

In the 10 years between March 2015 and March 2025 the number of awarding organisations regulated by Ofqual increased from 160 to 255, and from 2019 onwards, headcount was significantly impacted by Ofqual's role in the regulation of apprenticeship End Point Assessments.

Headcount numbers have reduced since March 2025, with the latest published figures (October 2025) being 351 excluding non-payroll staff, 352 including non-payroll staff and total Full Time Equivalent staff of 338, a reduction of 3.7% since 31 March.
